Bengals quarterback Andy Dalton and his wife Jordan gave back to the community on the team's day off Tuesday.

The couple opened a new multimedia center for patients at Cincinnati Children's Hospital.

The hub was stocked with gadgets to help entertain patients during treatment and recovery.

Andy Dalton also signed autographs and posed for pictures with patients.

"The whole goal is to give these kids something to look forward to and something that can take their mind off whatever situation they are going through. This is a fun way to do it. There will be iPads, computers, games and learning devices," Andy Dalton said.

The Daltons' foundation and the RCF Group made the hub possible. They first opened a hub at the children's hospital in Fort Worth.

"It's to help kids have that normal moment, that time when they can just be a kid. Nothing makes me prouder and nothing speaks more to the heart of Andy and Jordan (Dalton) and what they want to do than that opportunity," Cincinnati Children's Hospital Chief Operating Officer Scott Hamlin said.

The Daltons said they hope to open hubs at other hospitals sometime soon.

The Andy and Jordan Dalton Foundation was established to help impact the lives of critically and chronically ill children and their families. They concentrate their work in Cincinnati and Fort Worth.
